PARASHA (WEEKLY TORAH PORTION)

40Balak (Destroyer)

Torah: Num 22:2-25:9

Haftarah: Micah 5:6-6:8 (English Bible: Mi 5:7-6:8)

AS: 2Peter 2:1-22; Jude 11; Rev 2:14-15

Balak is the 40th in the annual cycle of Torah readings. It has 5,357 Hebrew letters, 1,455 Hebrew words, and 104 verses, and can occupy about 178 lines in a Torah Scroll. It is read in late June or July. Balak is sometimes combined with the previous parasha, Hukat, to help achieve the number of weekly readings needed. (Because each Scroll is the exact same, we know that no letters have been added nor subtracted.)

(chant the line in undertone) Baruch shem kavod malchuto layohlam va-ed

ואהבת את יהוה אלהיך בכל לבבך ובכל נפשך ובכל מאודך:

Vayahavta et YHVH* elohhaycha baychol lay-va-veh-cha uvchol nafshaycha uvchol mayoday-cha. (repeat twice)

Ve-ahavta lere-acha kamocho. Amen
