Ki Tavo is the 50th in the annual cycle of Torah readings. It has 6,811 Hebrew letters, 1,747 Hebrew words, and 122 verses, and can occupy about 261 lines in a Torah Scroll. It is read in September or, rarely, in late August. (Because each Scroll is the exact same, we know no letters have been added nor subtracted.)
