PARASHA (WEEKLY TORAH PORTION)

51Nitzavim (You are standing)

Torah: Deut 29:9*-30:20 (*English Bible – Dt 29:10-30:20)

Nitzavim is the 51st in the annual cycle of Torah readings. It has 2,123 Hebrew letters, 553 Hebrew words, and 40 verses, and can occupy about 72 lines in a Torah Scroll. It is read on the Sabbath immediately before Rosh Hashanah, in September or, rarely, late August or early October. Nitzavim is sometimes combined with the next parashah, Vayelech, to help achieve the number of weekly readings needed. (Because each Scroll is the exact same, we know no letters have been added nor subtracted.)
