Vayelekh is the 52nd in the annual cycle of Torah readings. It has 5,652 Hebrew letters, 1,484 Hebrew words, and 30 verses, and can occupy about 112 lines in a Torah Scroll. It is read in September or early October (or rarely, in late August). Vayelech is sometimes combined with the previous parashah, Nitzavim, to help achieve the number of weekly readings needed.

(Because each Scroll is the exact same, we know no letters have been added nor subtracted.)
