Bo is the 15th in the annual cycle of Torah readings. It has 6,149 Hebrew letters, 1,655 Hebrew words, 106 verses, and can occupy about 207 lines in a Torah Scroll. It is read in January or early February. Parts are read at Passover.

(Because each Scroll is the exact same, we know that no letters have been added nor subtracted.
