# \*Explanation of Terms for YHVH's spring calendar (note: Terms below are listed in the order they appear on the calendar.)

The 3 Spring Festivals fall on 3 consecutive days in the Gregorian month of March or April: Lunar month of Nisan

### Passover (מַסָה aka Pesach). 14 Nisan



- o The first spring festival is Passover.
- o Passover is mentioned 57 times in the TaNaKh (OT) & in the Apostolic Scriptures (NT).

Yeshua said, "I desire to eat this Passover with you." (Luke 22:15)

"Now this day will be a memorial to you, & you shall celebrate it as a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations you are to celebrate it as a permanent ordinance," (Ex 12:14 NASB. Also Ex 12:1, 11, 15-28, 42, 43, 48; 23:15. Lev: 23:4-8, 14. Deut 16. Num 9:13. 28:16, 33:33; Josh 5:10)

- o The English name is Passover; the Hebrew, *Pesach* (meaning "to passover" or "to skip over"); and the Greek word is *Pascha* (which unfortunately is often mistranslated as Easter in the NT).
- o Seder is Hebrew word for order; the Seder dictates the arrangement of the Passover ceremony. The Haggadah is the telling of the story of Passover.

#### Holy Assembly (aka Holy Convocation and Shabbat Shabbaton). 15 Nisan

O The spring Holy Assemblies (aka Holy Convocations) fall on the Gregorian-calendar day following erev Pesach (Seder) and the 7th Day of Pesach.

"On the first day you shall have a holy assembly [holy convocation; מֵקְרָא־קֹרָשׁ], and another holy assembly on the seventh day; no work at all shall be done on them, except what must be eaten by every person that alone may be prepared by you." (Ex 12:16, 23:7; Num 28:18 NASB).

# <sup>2</sup>Hag HaMatzot (תג הַמְצוֹת aka, Feast of Unleavened Bread). 15-21 Nisan



- o The second spring festival is Unleavened Bread.
- o "Then on the 15th day of the same month there is the Feast of Unleavened Bread to the LORD; for 7 days you shall eat unleavened bread." (Lev 23:6; also Deut 16:3; Ex 12:8, 12:15, 13:3, 34:18, 1Cor 5:8)
- o Matzah (bread without leavening) is eaten during 7 days of Hag HaMatzot. (Matzah pictures the haste with which the Hebrews left Egypt. (Ex 12:11, 17-18)

# <sup>3</sup> Counting the Omer. From 16 Nisan until 5 Sivan



- o From Hag HaBikurim, the 16th of Nisan, thru the day before Shavuot (Feast of Weeks or Pentecost). An omer (or sheaf is a unit of measure) of barley is counted and was taken daily to the Temple.
- o These 49 days serve as a reminder of the connection between the deliverance during slavery at Passover and the giving of Torah at Shavuot. (Lev 23:15-16)

# <sup>4</sup> Yom HaBikurim (יוֹם הַבְּכוּרִים aka first fruits). 16 Nisan

- o This is the 3rd of the 7 Feasts which God commanded the Israelites observe annually, during the barley harvest.

  (NOTE: The "Feast of First Fruits" is not to be mistaken with the "Feast of Harvest with the first fruits." Ex 23:16 NIV. The Feast of Harvest or Ingathering is also called the Feast of Shavuot, or Feast of Weeks, or Pentecost.)
- o The Priests waved the first sheaf (omer) before the Lord (Lev 23:9-14).

"This is to be a lasting ordinance for the generations to come, wherever you live." (Lev 2:14, 23:14c; Nu 28:26)

"Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the sons of Israel & say to them, When you enter the land which I am going to give to you & reap its harvest, then you shall bring in the sheaf of the first fruits of your harvest to the priest," (Lev 23:9-10).

# <sup>5</sup> Hag HaMatzot, 7<sup>th</sup> Day (aka Passover, 7<sup>th</sup> Day). 21 Nisan
