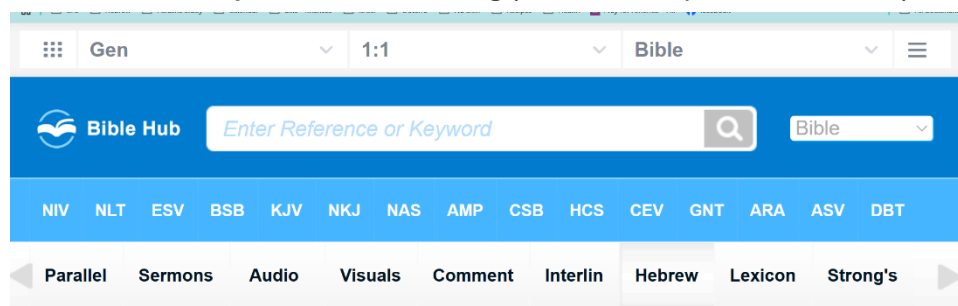


# Elementary BibleHub Basics

*BibleHub is a fantastic study tool! It's remarkable how much info is at your fingertips ... for free! We encourage you to make yourself familiar with these basics. (Later, we will discuss how to utilize other aspects of BibleHub.)*

1. Go to BibleHub: <https://biblehub.com/>
2. Enter the verse you are researching (in this example, it is Gen 1:1)



3. Select Hebrew ↑
4. The page below will come up – scroll to the English word you're studying. Look to the left of the English word & you will see Hebrew word used in that verse. (In this example, we're looking at *created*; the Hebrew word is בָּרָא (highlighted below))
5. Now, click on the number to the left of the Hebrew. (in this example, the Strong's number is 1254)

Unlike other Hebrew words for making or forming, "bara" is exclusively used in reference to God's creative acts, underscoring His sovereignty and omnipotence.
  - Cultural and Historical Background: In the ancient Near Eastern context, creation narratives were common, but the Hebrew Bible's account is distinct in its monotheistic perspective. The use of "bara" in Genesis 1:1 sets the tone for the biblical understanding of God as the sole Creator of the universe, contrasting with polytheistic creation myths of surrounding cultures. This foundational concept shaped Israel's worldview, emphasizing God's ultimate authority and the intentionality behind creation.

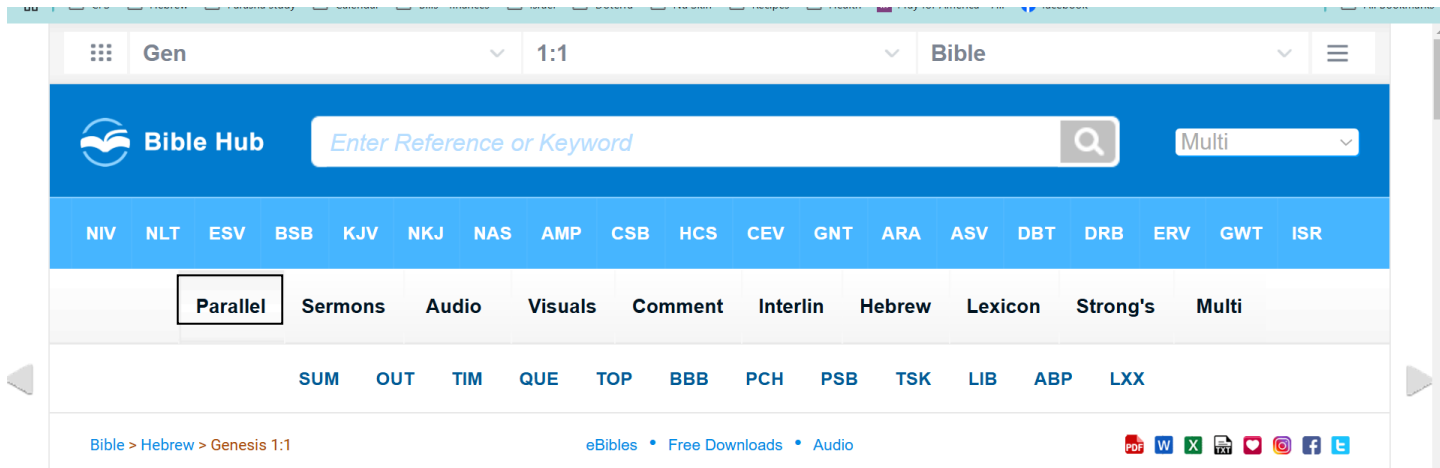

8. If the word you're researching has the NAS Exhaustive Concordance, notice how many times this word is translated as *alarm*, for instance. (It is translated 5 times as *alarm*.) It is translated as *shout* 10 times. While the other English translations are legitimate, they have a different nuance. We encourage you to use the more common, the English translation with the highest number of usages.
