

## Dependent or inseparable prepositions:

The second type of preposition is called the dependent or inseparable preposition. Unlike stand-alone prepositions, inseparable prepositions cannot be separated from the noun or the pronoun (pronominal suffix) to which they are attached.

The basic inseparable prepositions are \$\frac{1}{2}\$ (in); \$\frac{1}{2}\$ (like, as); \$\frac{1}{2}\$(to); and \$\frac{1}{2}\$ (from, out of).
